

**TOWN OF LYMAN BOARD OF SELECTMEN
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
MONDAY, JUNE 21, 2021 – 6:00 P.M. – LYMAN TOWN HALL**

Note: These are summary minutes. Minutes are not verbatim. Minutes may be paraphrased for clarity. Minutes are draft until approved by the Board of Selectmen.

SELECTMEN PRESENT: Chairman William Single, Vice-Chairman Ralph Blackington, John Tibbetts, David Alves, and Thomas Hatch.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Attendance was taken; a quorum was present.

ITEM #1 **ELECTION OF SELECT BOARD CHAIRMAN**

A **MOTION** was made by David Alves, seconded by Ralph Blackington, to elect William Single as Chairman of the Board of Selectmen. Motion passed 5-0-0.

ITEM #2 **ELECTION OF SELECT BOARD VICE-CHAIRMAN**

A **MOTION** was made by David Alves, seconded by Thomas Hatch, to elect Ralph Blackington as Vice-Chairman of the Board of Selectmen. Ralph Blackington voiced his discomfort in continuing to hold the position due to his lack of knowledge and experience with employee relation issues. Thomas Hatch offered to assist Ralph Blackington in that aspect of his role due to his knowledge and the relative experience he holds. Motion passed 5-0-0.

ITEM #3 **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

a. **Title 1 M.R.S.A. §405(6)(E) – Reason: Consultation with Legal Counsel**

A **MOTION** was made by Ralph Blackington, seconded by David Alves, to enter into Executive Session at 6:04 p.m. in accordance with Title 1 M.R.S.A. §405(6)(E) for consultation with legal counsel with Attorney Bradley Morin in attendance. Motion passed 5-0-0.

The Board of Selectmen ended Executive Session and returned to Regular Session at 7:34 p.m.

ITEM #4 **SPECIAL OFFERS / PRESENTATIONS**

a. **Susan Briggs, et al – So Waterboro Rd – Speed Limits & Road Traffic**
Susan Briggs, So Waterboro Road, and Candace Platt, So Waterboro Road came forward to speak regarding deteriorating road conditions, safety improvements needed to the road, motorists exceeding speed limits, the number of motor vehicle accidents having occurred on the road, vehicles passing other vehicles on the road, and the high number of dump trucks traveling the road daily. They submitted a

petition and other documentation gathered to support their case, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof. Officer Benjamin Handzel came forward to explain enforcement action and presented data and statistics relative to motorist speed and vehicle crashes. Open discussion was held regarding the speed limit on the road, road reconstruction for safety, the State program for matching town funds, State Police staffing and shift schedules, Contract Deputies, and Flashing Speed Signs.

ITEM #5 **HEARING OF DELEGATIONS / PUBLIC INPUT**

a. Public Input – *Public in attendance will have up to 5 minutes to address the Board*

Victoria Gavel spoke with regard to Selectmen John Tibbetts, his indication of resignation from the Board of Selectmen, the history and severity of personnel/staff matters at Town Hall, and the lack of financial information the Select Board had available for discussion at the past Annual Town Meeting which gave the impression of not caring what the townspeople had to say.

An unidentified man spoke with regard to the town taking over Goodwin Mills Cemetery.

Bob St. Onge spoke with regard to the Select Board acting as a board in making decisions referencing Town Charter Section 306, the Select Board Chair having no extra administrative duties, resolving the hostile work environment existing at Town Hall, and the need to establish rules to stop the impropriety that is occurring before the town loses more employees.

Maurice St. Clair spoke with regard to the Select Board re-visiting how much money will be taken out of Surplus and Excise to lower taxes.

Fred Bechard spoke with regard to re-visiting the budget and the amount of money being held by the town as savings in case something happens.

Michelle Feliccitti spoke to ask if all mail received by the Select Board can be sent out with the agenda that is e-mailed. William Single stated it is the goal to have equipment in place to present the mail live at the meeting.

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Ralph Blackington, to amend the minutes of the Emergency Meeting dated June 1, 2021, to reflect that John Tibbetts requested the meeting be in open session and not executive session. Motion passed 4-0-1 (Thomas Hatch abstained).

A **MOTION** was made by Ralph Blackington, seconded by John Tibbetts, to accept the minutes of the Emergency Meeting dated June 1, 2021, as amended. Motion passed 4-0-1 (Thomas Hatch abstained).

ITEM #7

SIGN WARRANTS

a. Payroll Warrant # 56 in the amount of \$31,044.31

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Ralph Blackington, to approve Payroll Warrant # 56 in the amount of \$31,044.31. Motion carried 4-1-0 (David Alves against).

David Alves explained his vote against approving warrants was due to the glitch in the Trio Program not yet being corrected and also to missing the appointment for testing Trio Web. He noted for the record he does not believe the person running the program is doing anything wrong and that this issue is solely with the software itself.

b. Payroll Warrant # 58 in the amount of \$721.19

A MOTION was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Ralph Blackington, to approve Payroll Warrant # 58 in the amount of \$721.19. Motion carried 4-1-0 (David Alves against).

c. Payable Warrant # 59 in the amount of \$186,583.43

A MOTION was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Ralph Blackington, to approve Payable Warrant #59 in the amount of \$186,583.43. Motion carried 4-1-0 (David Alves against).

ITEM #8

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

a. 12 Basswood Court – Cleanup of junk on property

William Single reported the Interim CEO was looking into this issue further and will hopefully have a status update at the next meeting.

b. Old Kennebunk Road – Road Work

Brad Nickel reported 700' of road will be paved within the next two weeks and the ditch has been cleaned out and re-dug for the water to drain away from the house driveway.

c. Oscar Littlefield Road – Road Work

William Single referenced the documentation submitted by property owners and correspondence from the town attorney obtained from archives. He stated it would need to be reviewed and further discussion would need to be held to ensure the town is insured and fully protected should any investment in the road be made.

ITEM #9

DEPARTMENT AND COMMITTEE REPORTS

a. Tax Collector

Reference was made to the report submitted.

b. Treasurer's Expenditure Status Report

Reference was made to the report submitted.

Discussion was held regarding the heads of the departments and committees being present at the meetings to address any questions or concerns. The following action was taken:

A MOTION was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by David Alves, to have department and committee heads plan to be present at Board of Selectmen meetings so that there is no waiting for answers to questions that come up. Motion passed 5-0-0.

ITEM #10 **NEW BUSINESS**

a. **Lyman Woods Subdivision (Approved 2003) – Still valid or new approval required**

Discussion was held wherein it was noted this subdivision was approved by the Planning Board in 2003 and no permits or work was ever started since. The approved plan was viewed by members of the Select Board. The following action was taken:

A **MOTION** was made by David Alves, seconded by John Tibbetts, to have the applicants re-submit an application and plans to the Planning Board. Motion passed 5-0-0.

b. **Vote to appoint Irene Single as Interim Planning Board Clerk**

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Ralph Blackington, to appoint Irene Single as Interim Planning Board Clerk. Motion passed 5-0-0.

c. **Vote on Appointments for July 1, 2021**

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Thomas Hatch, to vote the appointments as a whole instead of individually. Motion passed 5-0-0.

William Single read aloud the appointment names and positions listed. The following action was taken:

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Ralph Blackington, to appoint the individuals to the positions as read. Motion passed 5-0-0.

d. **Charter Commission–Application for Appointment – Judith St. Onge**

A **MOTION** was made by David Alves, seconded by John Tibbetts, to appoint Judith St. Onge to the Charter Revision Commission. Motion passed 5-0-0.

It was noted the Select Board is required to appoint one more person to serve on this Commission. The following action was taken:

A **MOTION** was made by David Alves, seconded by John Tibbetts, to advertise the need for one person to serve on the Charter Revision Commission. Motion passed 5-0-0.

e. **Birch Tree Food Truck – Request to operate business at Kennebunk Beach Parking Lot**

It was noted this business was there last year and the question is whether the Select Board will object to them doing the same this year. Discussion was held regarding the amount of space taken up in the parking lot, the owners removing any trash generated, and the Kennebunk Pond Committee findings. The following action was taken:

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by David Alves, to not object to Birch Tree Food Truck operating as requested at Kennebunk Beach Parking Lot. Motion passed 5-0-0.

f. **57 Huff Road – Request for zone change**

Discussion was held wherein it was noted a zone change must go before the Planning Board and would require a town vote. Property owner Charleen Roy was present and explained they have approximately 9.75 acres however the property zone does not allow her to grant a portion of the land to her children to build on so a zone change is requested. She asked for guidance on how to proceed. It was mentioned that a town vote already occurred changing the residential zoning to be if the house was within the first 500 feet from black-top then that would be considered a 3-acre zoned lot (residential) and anything remaining in the parcel would be considered a 5-acre zoned lot (general purpose) for building so one additional home could be constructed on the Roy's property. It was suggested she check with the Code Enforcement Officer before proceeding.

g. **Approve Animal Welfare Society Contract 7/1/21 – 6/30/22**

William Single reported the fee based on population totals \$6,038.16. The following action was taken:

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Thomas Hatch, to approve the Animal Welfare Society Contract. Motion passed 5-0-0.

h. **Trio Web – Assign Project Manager**

Discussion was held regarding qualifications to perform this task, if the task was in a job description, and why the task is being given up. The following action was taken:

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by David Alves, to discuss this in more detail with the Treasurer and invite her to attend the next meeting. Motion passed 5-0-0.

i. **Address Budget Cuts made at Annual Town Meeting**

William Single noted three of the budget items cut as follows: Contingency, Professional Services, and Maintenance & Repair. He stated this discussion really needs the Treasurer to be present to answer questions and explain available options. The following action was taken:

A **MOTION** was made by John Tibbetts, seconded by Thomas Hatch, to add this item to the agenda for the special meeting Monday night. Motion passed 5-0-0.

Maurice St. Clair asked what the pay rate increases were for the Transfer Station workers. John Tibbetts answered they were substantial, more than COLA, and suggested he speak further with the Treasurer.

Ken Burr asked if there would be more discussion on the \$1.9 million overlay. William Single stated they will have to find out more and will be speaking with the Treasurer to see where the town stands. It will be brought up at the next meeting.

ADJOURN

A **MOTION** was made by David Alves, seconded by John Tibbetts, to adjourn the meeting at 9:23 p.m. Motion passed 5-0-0.

We the undersigned request that a traffic study be done. The current speed limit of 45 mph on S Waterboro Rd is outdated. There have been multiple accidents and deaths related to speeding on this winding and hilly road. There are many driveway entrances on to this road that are blind.

The current speed limit of 45 mph is ignored and speeds in excess of the posted speed limit are in excess of 50 mph and has become the norm. Efforts to have law enforcement patrol this area has failed. Under MDOT guidelines it is the duty of the town Road Commissioner to address this issue and perform a Road Study.

We are requesting that such a study be done and take into consideration that the current speed limit be reviewed between Huff Rd and Brock Rd where it is posted 45 mph.

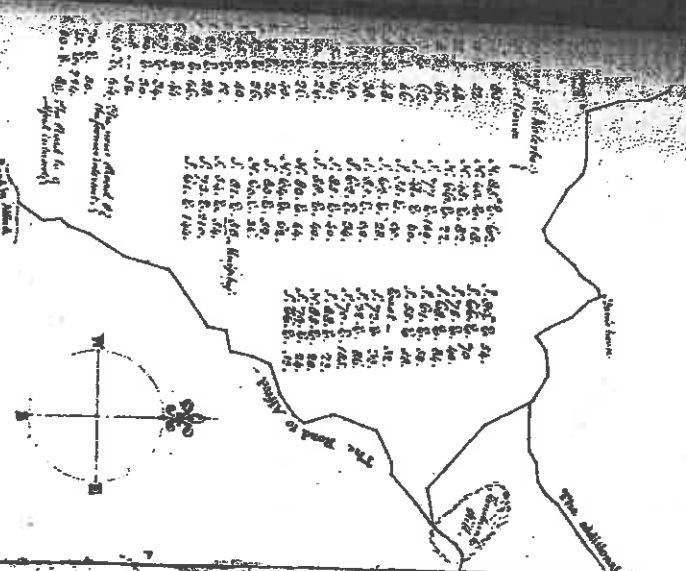
York sh. To John Frost, John Hovey, Joshua Hubbard, Samuel Nason, & William Parsons Esqrs greeting.
Whereas it was represented to the Court of General Sessions of the Peace, when sitting at Waterborough, within & for the county of York, by the petition of a number of inhabitants said county, praying for a Highway to be laid out from the present Highway near Middleford Court house to Waterborough Court house, nearly in a direct line:— Therefore you the said John Frost, John Hovey, Joshua Hubbard, Samuel Nason & William Parsons, are appointed a Committee to view the ground mentioned in said petition, and consider the expediency of laying out a Highway as aforesaid, and if, after viewing the same, it appears of common conveniency and necessity, then you are to lay out a Highway from the Road near the Court house at Middleford to Waterborough Court house, in such way and manner as will be most beneficial to the publick and least prejudicial to private property: And you are to give due notice to all persons interested to be present, if they see cause; And you are to ascertain the place and course of said way in the best way and manner you can; and if any person be injured in his property by the laying out of said Highway, you are to estimate the damage as you shall think just and equitable. And make return hereof under your hands and seals, or the major part of you, unto the said Court of General Sessions of the Peace, upon oath, in order that the same may be accepted & recorded, as the law directs. Given under the seal of the said Court of General Sessions of the Peace, the ninth day of September, in the year of our Lord, 1794.

York sh. October 28. 1794: Then the within named John Frost Esq. personally appeared and made oath that in laying

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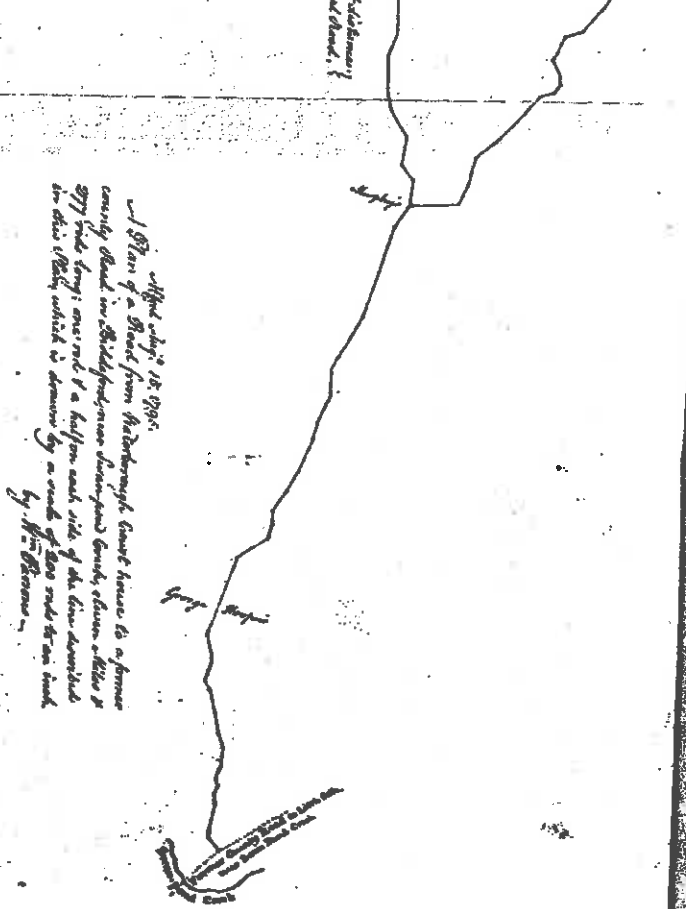


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and running the several courses and distances as described and delineated on the annexed plan: the Road to be three rods wide, one rod and an half on each side of the line we run.

The foregoing report having being made at November term 1794, and some objections being made thereto, the same was then recommitted to the aforesaid Committee for their reconsideration and amendment: And said Committee was also empowered to lay out another Highway from near the head of Hammelunk pond to the Road laid out thro Sanford to the river, we prayed for in the aforesaid petition; if after viewing the ground and considering the circumstances, it shall appear necessary: to be given and damages to be asked in the usual manner. Which Committee now report as follows.

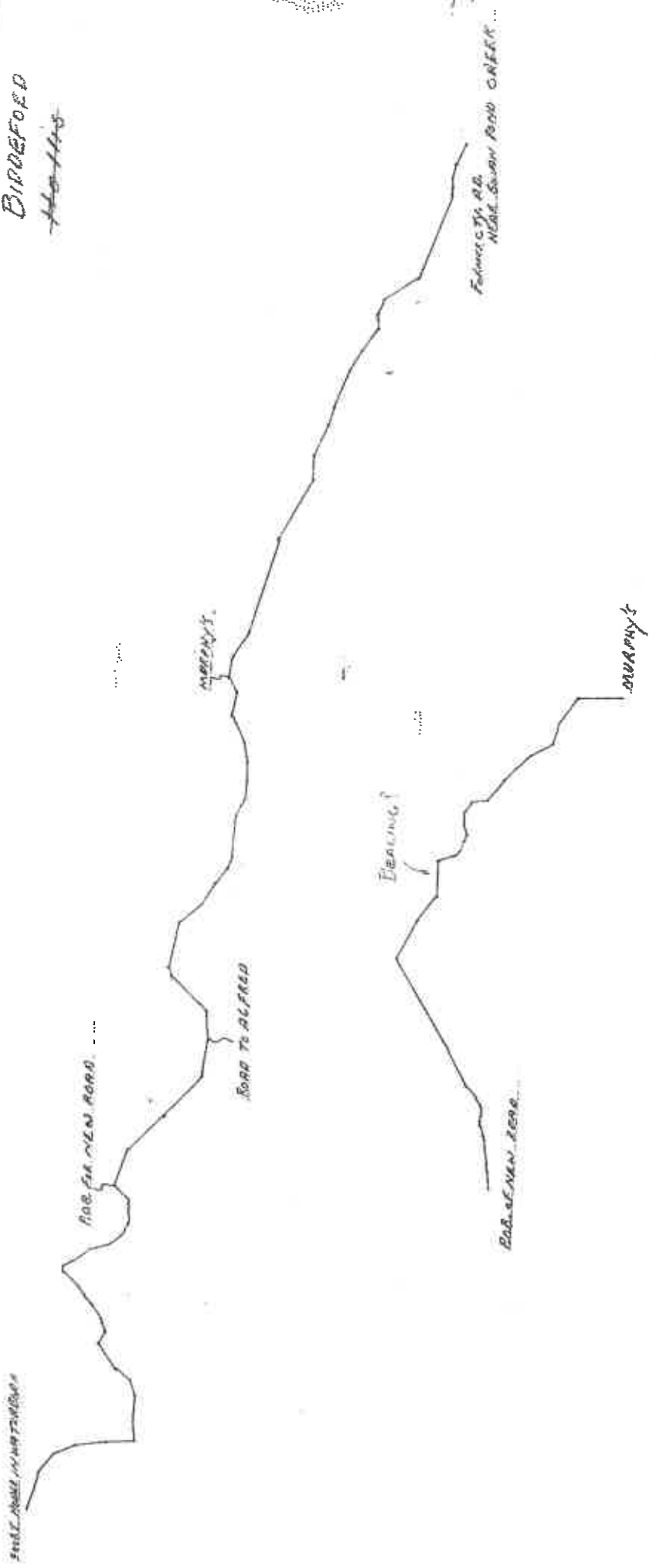

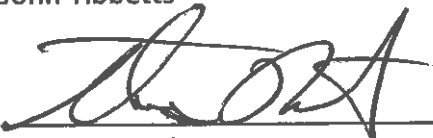

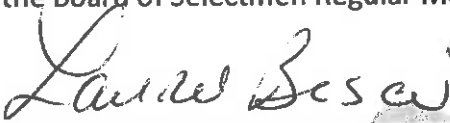
