Signed into law, March 11th, 2021, the American Rescue Plan Act provides additional funding for local governments. The funds must be spent or allocated by 2024 to respond to immediate public health and financial stability needs, and support households, workers and business's that were hit hardest by the pandemic. The funds are also intended to be used to make strategic long-term infrastructure investments for a strong economic and equitable recovery

The Town of Lyman received \$477,620.85 in ARPA Funds of which \$165,906.23 has been allocated to purchase equipment for the Goodwins Mills Fire and Rescue. That leaves the Town with \$311,714.62 in ARPA funds.

The purpose of this survey is to assist the Town of Lyman in determining the best use of funds received from ARPA.
