Safety Bulletin

2 Lehigh County Firefighters die while fighting a fire in PA. For those who travel to the National Fire Academy we often drive right through Lehigh County on our way. While the cause has yet to be released, a man was found outside with a self-inflicted gunshot wound. Goodwin's Mills Responded to a similar incident in the late 1990s at the former Cohen Egg farm on Rt. 5 in Dayton, when a man wanted for shooting a women in Biddeford came to Dayton, lit a barn afire and shot himself inside the building. No FFs were hurt that night, but it took over an hour before anyone knew the incidents were connected, then it took a long time before crews learned FF were not targets.

It is that time of year when we seek nominations for awards. Please place your <u>nominations for 2022 using this form</u>. We know we have some catching up to do for some other awards over the past couple of years.

My copies of the <u>Burn documentary series</u> have arrived. I spent a few hours watching them this weekend, and they are very good. Burn was filmed in Detroit, the fire capital of the country.
