To Taxpayers Aged 65 and older...

The Property Tax Stabilization Program (LD290) has been repealed by the

Legislature. Any taxpayer whose application was submitted prior to December 1, 2022 and approved, will still receive the "freeze" on their 2023-2024 property tax bill. Since the program has ended, there will be no re-application for you to file. The program will end and no longer exist. Once again, your tax bill will only be frozen once, this upcoming tax bill only, and you are no longer required to file a new application every year thereafter.

A new law will take its place. It expands the following two programs for the qualifying property taxpayer Aged 65 and older. And, if qualified, you can be enrolled in both.

 Property Tax Fairness Credit – Administered by the State of Maine Revenue Services The current credit of \$1,500 has been expanded to \$2,000.
To claim the credit, you must file certain income tax forms. 1040ME and Schedule PTFC/STFC.

- Property Tax Deferral Program Administered by the State of Maine Revenue Services The current income and asset limits have been expanded to \$80,000 or less (income) and \$100,000/\$150,000 or less (liquid assets).

Applications must be filed with the Lyman Assessor's Office between January 1 and April 1 each year. The application is then forwarded to Maine Revenue Services for review and determination for acceptance and approval.

This program will pay the tax bills for certain Maine residents who meet income and asset requirements. <u>This is a loan program that requires repayment with interest once</u> the property is sold or becomes part of an estate.
